Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 1 is a new section that contains references to definitions of "criminal justice agency", "sex trafficking", and "sexual assault". This section would also require law enforcement and prosecutors to maintain the confidentiality of the identity and identifying information of the alleged victim.

Section 2 would amend Sec. 55-182 to make a harmonizing change.

Section 3 would amend Sec. 79-2,144 to make a harmonizing change.

Section 4 would amend Sec. 84-712.05 to add an exception to Nebraska's public records statutes for the identity and personal identifying information of an alleged victim of sexual assault or sex trafficking.

Explanation of amendments:

AM1842

The amendment would provide an additional exception to the confidentiality requirement to allow criminal justice agencies to share information about an alleged victim with an educational entity.
