A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Barber Act; to amend sections 71-201,
 71-208.02, and 71-219, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
 eliminate provisions relating to booth rental permits; to change
 requirements for registration as a barber instructor or assistant
 barber instructor; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original
 sections; to outright repeal section 71-219.05, Reissue Revised
 Statutes of Nebraska; and to declare an emergency.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 71-201, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 71-201 (1) No person shall practice or attempt to practice 4 barbering without a license issued pursuant to the Barber Act by the 5 board. It shall be unlawful to operate a barber shop unless it is at all 6 times under the direct supervision and management of a licensed barber.

7 (2)(a) No person, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation shall operate a barber shop or barber school until a license 8 9 has been obtained for that purpose from the board. If the applicant is an 10 individual, the application shall include the applicant's social security number. No person shall lease space on the premises of a barber shop to 11 12 engage in the practice of barbering as an independent contractor or a 13 self-employed person without obtaining a booth rental permit as provided in section 71-219.05. All barber shop licenses and booth rental permits 14 shall be issued on or before June 30 of each even-numbered year, shall be 15 effective as of July 1 of each even-numbered year, shall be valid for two 16 17 years, and shall expire on June 30 of the next succeeding even-numbered 18 year.

19 (b) No booth rental permits shall be required after the effective
20 date of this act.

21 <u>(3)</u> Any barber shop which fails to renew its license or any person 22 who fails to renew his or her booth rental permit on or before the 23 expiration date may renew such license or booth rental permit by payment 24 of the renewal fee and a late renewal fee established by the board within 25 sixty days after such date or such other time period as the board 26 establishes.

27 <u>(4)</u> Any barber shop or barber school license and any booth rental 28 permit may be suspended, revoked, or denied renewal by the board for 29 violation of any provision of the statutes or any rule or regulation of 30 the board pertaining to the operation or sanitation of barber shops<u>or</u> τ 31 barber schools, or booths under a booth rental permit after due notice

1 and hearing before the board.

2 (5) No person, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation shall use the title of barber or barber shop or indicate in 3 4 any way that such person or entity offers barbering services unless such 5 person or entity is licensed pursuant to the act. No person, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation shall hold itself out as a 6 7 barber shop or indicate in any way that such person or entity offers barbering services unless such person or entity and the personnel who 8 9 purport to offer barbering services in association with such person or entity are licensed pursuant to the act. 10

11 (6) No person, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation shall display a barber pole or use a barber pole or the image 12 13 of a barber pole in its advertising unless such person or entity is licensed to provide barbering services pursuant to the act and the 14 display or use of such barber pole or barber pole image is to indicate 15 that the person or entity is offering barbering services. 16

Sec. 2. Section 71-208.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

71-208.02 (1) All instruction in barber schools shall be conducted
 by registered barber instructors or registered assistant barber
 instructors.

(2) A person shall be eligible for registration as a barberinstructor if:

(a) He or she has completed at least eighteen hours of college
credit at or above the postsecondary level, including at least three
credit hours each in (i) methods of teaching, (ii) curriculum
development, (iii) special vocational needs, (iv) educational psychology,
(v) speech communications, and (vi) introduction to business;

(b) He or she has been a licensed and actively practicing barber for
the one year immediately preceding application, except that for good
cause the board may waive the requirement that the applicant be an

actively practicing barber for one year or that such year immediately
 precede application;

3 (c) He or she has served as a registered assistant barber instructor 4 under the supervision of an active, full-time, registered barber 5 instructor, as provided in subsection (5) of this section, for <u>nine</u> 6 <u>months</u> one year immediately preceding application for registration, 7 except that for good cause the board may waive the requirement that such 8 <u>nine-month period</u> year immediately precede application;

(d) He or she has passed an examination prescribed by the board; and(e) He or she has paid the fees prescribed by section 71-219.

(3) One registered barber instructor or assistant barber instructor 11 shall be employed for each fifteen students, or fraction thereof, 12 enrolled in a barber school, except that each barber school shall have 13 14 not less than two instructors, one of whom shall be a registered barber instructor, regardless of the number of students. Additional assistant 15 16 barber instructors shall be permitted on a working ratio of two assistant barber instructors for every registered barber instructor. A barber 17 school operated by a nonprofit organization which neither charges any 18 19 tuition to its students nor makes any charge to the persons upon whom work is performed shall not be required to have more than one instructor, 20 regardless of the number of students, which instructor shall be a 21 22 registered barber instructor.

(4) No student at a barber school shall be permitted to do any
 practical work upon any person unless a registered barber instructor or
 registered assistant barber instructor is on the premises and supervising
 the practical work being performed.

(5)(a) A person shall be eligible for registration as an assistant barber instructor if he or she has paid the fee prescribed by section 71-219, has been a licensed and actively practicing barber for one year, and is currently enrolled or will enroll at the first regular college enrollment date after registration under this section in an educational

program leading to completion of the hours required under subsection (2)
 of this section.

3 (b) A person registered pursuant to subdivision (a) of this 4 subsection shall serve as an assistant barber instructor under direct 5 supervision, except that he or she may serve as an assistant barber 6 instructor under indirect supervision if:

7 (i) He or she has completed nine college credit hours, including
8 three credit hours each in methods of teaching, curriculum development,
9 and special vocational needs; and

10 (ii) He or she has completed <u>nine months</u> one year of instructor 11 training under the direct inhouse supervision of an active, full-time, 12 registered barber instructor or in lieu thereof has completed the 13 requirements of a barber instructor course developed or approved by the 14 board. The board may develop such courses or approve courses developed by 15 educational institutions or other entities which meet requirements 16 established by the board in rules and regulations.

17 (c) A report of college credits earned pursuant to subsection (2) of this section shall be submitted to the board at the end of each academic 18 year. Registration as an assistant barber instructor shall be renewed in 19 each even-numbered year and shall be valid for three years from the date 20 of registration if the registrant pursues without interruption the 21 educational program described in subsection (2) of this section. A 22 23 registrant who fails to so maintain such program shall have his or her 24 registration revoked. Any such registration that has been revoked shall 25 be reinstated if all renewal fees have been paid and other registration requirements of this subsection are met. 26

(6) A person who is a registered barber instructor before September
9, 1993, may continue to practice as a registered barber instructor on
and after such date without meeting the changes in the registration
requirements of this section imposed by Laws 1993, LB 226. A person who
is a registered assistant barber instructor before September 9, 1993, and

1 who seeks to register as a barber instructor on or after September 9, 2 1993, may meet the requirements for registration as a barber instructor 3 either as such requirements existed before such date or as such 4 requirements exist on or after such date.

5 Sec. 3. Section 71-219, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 6 amended to read:

71-219 The board shall set the fees to be paid:

8 (1) By an applicant for an examination to determine his or her 9 fitness to receive a license to practice barbering or a registration as a 10 barber instructor and for the issuance of the license or registration;

11 (2) By an applicant for registration as an assistant barber 12 instructor;

13 (3) For the renewal of a license to practice barbering and for
14 restoration of an inactive license;

15 (4) For the renewal of a registration to practice as a barber
16 instructor and for the restoration of an inactive registration;

17 (5) For renewal of a registration to practice as an assistant barber18 instructor;

19 (6) For late renewal of a license issued under the Barber Act;

20 (7) For an application for a license to establish a barber shop or
21 barber school and for the issuance of a license;

(8) For the transfer of license or change of ownership of a barbershop or barber school;

(9) For renewal of a barber license, barber instructor registration,
barber shop license, or barber school license;

26 (10) For an application for a temporary license to conduct classes27 of instruction in barbering;

(11) For an affidavit for purposes of reciprocity or for issuance of
 a certification of licensure for purposes of reciprocity;

30 (12) For an application for licensure without examination pursuant
31 to section 71-239.01 and for the issuance of a license pursuant to such

1 section;

2 (13) For issuance of a booth rental permit under section 71-219.05;
 3 (13) (14) For the sale of listings or labels; and

4 <u>(14)</u> (15) For a returned check because of insufficient funds or no 5 funds.

Sec. 4. Original sections 71-201, 71-208.02, and 71-219, Reissue
Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.

8 Sec. 5. The following section is outright repealed: Section
9 71-219.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

Sec. 6. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when passed and approved according to law.
