Introduced by Speaker Hilgers, 21; at the request of the Governor.

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to state intent; to define
- 2 terms; to appropriate funds allocated to the State of Nebraska from
- 3 the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to the
- 4 federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, 42 U.S.C. 802, as amended;
- 5 and to declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
3 the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, which
4 appropriates funds, FY2021-22 means the period July 1, 2021, through June
5 30, 2022; FY2022-23 means the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023;
6 FY2023-24 means the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024; and
7 FY2024-25 means the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

8 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

9 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2021-22 and FY2022-23, the sums
10 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from Federal Funds.
11 The Federal Funds appropriated in this act are from the funds allocated
12 to the State of Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal
13 Recovery Fund pursuant to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021,
14 42 U.S.C. 802, as amended. The sums set forth in this act for FY2022-23
15 shall be made available by the budget administrator of the budget
16 division of the Department of Administrative Services only upon
17 confirmation that such funds have been received and made available to the
18 State of Nebraska under 42 U.S.C. 802, as amended.

19 Sec. 3. UNEXPENDED BALANCES AND CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.

20 All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2022, are hereby
21 reappropriated for FY2022-23, which amounts shall be in addition to the
22 amounts shown in this act.

23 Sec. 4. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCES, FY2021-22 to FY2022-23;
24 FY2022-23 to FY2023-24; FY2023-24 to FY2024-25.

25 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
26 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances of the
27 Federal Funds appropriated in this act existing on June 30, 2022, for
28 FY2022-23 to the respective agencies, programs, and funds listed in this
29 act, except as otherwise provided in this act.

30 It is the intent of the Legislature that all unexpended
31 appropriation balances of the Federal Funds appropriated in this act

1 existing on June 30, 2023, be reappropriated for FY2023-24 to the
2 respective agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act.

3 It is the intent of the Legislature that of the Federal Funds
4 appropriated and reappropriated in this act only the amounts obligated by
5 June 30, 2024, be reappropriated for FY2024-25 to the respective
6 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act.

7 Sec. 5. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

8 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
9 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are
10 hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act.

11 Sec. 6. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

12 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
13 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the
14 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
15 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
16 appropriate funds.

17 Sec. 7. PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY PREMIUM PAY.

18 There are hereby appropriated for FY2021-22 the following amounts of
19 Federal Funds estimate related to premium pay for Public Health and
20 Public Safety positions as a result of COVID-19 conditions, totaling
21 \$36,700,000. The appropriations in this section shall be allocated
22 according to the following agency and program classifications:

7 (1) There is included in the appropriation to this program for
8 FY2021-22 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for state aid, which shall
9 only be used for such purpose. There is included in the appropriation to
10 this program for FY2022-23 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for state
11 aid, which shall only be used for such purpose.

12 (2) There is included in the amount shown as aid for FY2021-22
13 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate to provide family-directed education
14 recovery accounts for low-income children and families impacted by the
15 COVID-19 pandemic. There is included in the amount shown as aid for
16 FY2022-23 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for family-directed
17 education recovery accounts for low-income children and families impacted
18 by the COVID-19 pandemic.

19 (3) The State Department of Education shall contract with an
20 organization, or other capable vendor, by July 1, 2022, to administer a
21 three-year pilot program, for school years 2022-23, 2023-24, and 2024-25,
22 to provide family-directed education recovery accounts. The amount of
23 funding available for any school year shall be no more than \$20,000,000.
24 The department shall establish the application and application process
25 with the selected organization or vendor. The administrative costs of the
26 selected organization or vendor shall not exceed ten percent of the
27 amount of funding provided in a school year.

28 (4) A child shall be eligible to participate if the child (a) is a
29 Nebraska resident, (b) attends a public, nonpublic, or exempt school in
30 grades kindergarten through 12, and (c) has a family income that would
31 qualify for the federal free-lunch program. The total amount of an award

1 for a child shall not exceed \$2,000 for each school year of the program.
2 If there are not sufficient funds to award to all applicants, then first
3 priority shall be for a child with demonstrated academic deficiency in
4 mathematics, science, or language arts. The next priority shall be for a
5 child who has a sibling already receiving funding. The remaining
6 applications shall be funded on a first come, first served basis.

7 (5) Funds shall be used to address the learning loss resulting from
8 the COVID-19 pandemic by paying for eligible educational services.
9 Eligible educational services include, but are not limited to, private
10 school tuition, tutoring, digital-learning subscriptions, exempt school
11 curriculum, and other K-12 educational services. Funds shall be paid,
12 upon written direction provided by a parent or guardian, to the entity
13 providing eligible educational services to the child. Funds may not be
14 used to purchase computing devices or equipment. Funding shall continue
15 with an eligible child from the time of the award for the duration of the
16 pilot program.

17 (6) By August 1 after the end of each school year of the pilot
18 program and by August 1 one-year after the pilot program has ended, the
19 department shall collect available student performance data in
20 mathematics, science, and language arts and report, in the aggregate,
21 such data to the Governor and the Legislature. Such report shall be
22 submitted electronically.

23 (7) It is the intent of the Legislature that funding for family-
24 directed education recovery accounts continue until FY2025-26.

25 (8) Any administrative expenditures related to the use of Federal
26 Funds estimate appropriated pursuant to this section shall be expended
27 through the Federal Fund appropriation for administrative costs to the
28 Military Department, Agency 31, Program 191, as identified in section 20
29 of this act.

18 shall not receive more than \$15,000,000 in total funding from the
19 appropriation to this program.

20 A community college shall make a grant application to the commission
21 for funding for a capital project or for offering a course that meets the
22 criteria established by the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and
23 the commission and that is limited to students with a high school diploma
24 or its equivalent. A community college receiving funding from this
25 program shall meet all necessary federal and commission compliance and
