- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to adopt the
- 2 Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia Support Act; to create the
- 3 Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia Advisory Council; and to
- 4 require a plan.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 cited as the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia Support Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. The Legislature hereby finds and declares that Alzheimer's
- and other dementia is of significant concern to the State of Nebraska, 4
- and that the Legislature and the state would benefit from a more 5
- coordinated approach to addressing Alzheimer's disease and other 6
- 7 dementia.
- Sec. 3. For purposes of the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia 8
- 9 Support Act:
- 10 (1) Council means the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia
- Advisory Council; and 11
- (2) Department means the Department of Health and Human Services. 12
- 13 (1) The Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementia Advisory Sec. 4.
- Council is created and shall include: 14
- 15 (a) Eleven voting members appointed by the chief executive officer
- of the Department of Health and Human Services. The voting members shall 16
- 17 consist of: (i) An individual living with Alzheimer's disease or another
- dementia or a family member of such an individual; (ii) an individual who 18
- 19 is the family caregiver of an individual living with Alzheimer's disease
- or another dementia; (iii) an individual who represents nursing homes; 20
- 21 (iv) an individual who represents assisted-living facilities; (v) an
- 22 individual who represents providers of adult day care services; (vi) an
- individual who represents home care providers; (vii) a medical 23
- professional who has experience diagnosing and treating Alzheimer's 24
- 25 disease; (viii) an individual who conducts research regarding Alzheimer's
- disease or other dementia; (ix) an individual who represents a leading, 26
- 27 nationwide organization that advocates on behalf of individuals living
- 28 with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; (x) an individual who
- represents an area agency on aging; and (xi) an individual representing 29
- 30 an organization that advocates for older adults; and
- (b) Five nonvoting members. The nonvoting members shall consist of: 31

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- 1 (i) The Director of Public Health or the director's designee; (ii) the
- 2 <u>director of the Division of Medicaid and Long-Term Care or the director's</u>
- 3 designee; (iii) a representative of the State Unit on Aging designated by
- 4 the director of the Division of Medicaid and Long-Term Care; (iv) a
- 5 representative of the Nebraska Workforce Development Board designated by
- 6 the board; and (v) the state long-term care ombudsman or the ombudsman's
- 7 designee.
- 8 (2) The chief executive officer of the Department of Health and
- 9 Human Services shall make the appointments within ninety days after the
- 10 <u>effective date of this act. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner</u>
- 11 as the original appointments.
- 12 (3) The voting members of the council shall serve for a term of two
- 13 years. If there is no suitable successor who meets the criteria, the
- 14 <u>voting member can be reappointed to an additional term of two years.</u>
- 15 (4) Members of the council shall select the chairperson and vice-
- 16 chairperson who shall not be employees of the state and shall serve in
- 17 <u>such role for up to two consecutive years. The chief executive officer of</u>
- 18 the Department of Health and Human Services or the chief executive
- 19 officer's designee shall call and preside over the first meeting until a
- 20 <u>chairperson is selected. Thereafter, the council shall meet at least</u>
- 21 quarterly at the call of the chairperson. A majority of the voting
- 22 members shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of meetings.
- 23 (5) The council shall hold its first meeting not later than thirty
- 24 days after the appointment of its members and shall hold subsequent
- 25 meetings at least once every calendar quarter.
- 26 <u>(6) Council members shall serve without compensation but shall be</u>
- 27 <u>compensated for expenses incurred for such service.</u>
- 28 (7) The Department of Health and Human Services and the office of
- 29 Legislative Research shall provide staff and support to the council as
- 30 necessary to assist the council in the performance of its duties.
- 31 Sec. 5. (1) The purpose of the council shall be to examine (a) the

- 1 <u>needs of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia,</u>
- 2 (b) the services available in the state for those individuals and their
- 3 family caregivers, and (c) the ability of health care providers and
- 4 facilities to meet the current and future needs of such individuals.
- 5 (2) The council shall collaborate with the Department of Health and
- 6 Human Services and other departments as needed to gather input on issues
- 7 and strategies that pertain to Alzheimer's disease and other dementia and
- 8 identify proactive approaches on public health, workforce, caregiver
- 9 support, and care delivery. The council shall monitor analysis, policy
- 10 <u>development</u>, and program implementation related to Alzheimer's disease
- 11 <u>and other dementia.</u>
- 12 Sec. 6. <u>The council shall consider and make findings and</u>
- 13 <u>recommendations on the following topics:</u>
- 14 (1) Trends in the state's Alzheimer's disease and other dementia
- 15 populations and service needs including:
- 16 (a) The state's role in providing or facilitating long-term care,
- 17 <u>family caregiver support, and assistance to those with early-stage or</u>
- 18 early-onset Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;
- 19 (b) The state's policies regarding individuals with Alzheimer's
- 20 <u>disease or other dementia;</u>
- 21 (c) The fiscal impact of Alzheimer's disease and other dementia on
- 22 publicly funded health care programs; and
- 23 (d) The establishment of a surveillance system to better determine
- 24 the number of individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or other
- 25 dementia and to monitor changes to such numbers;
- 26 (2) Existing resources, services, and capacity relating to the
- 27 diagnosis and care of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or
- 28 other dementia, including:
- 29 <u>(a) The type, cost, and availability of dementia care services;</u>
- 30 (b) The availability of health care workers who can serve people
- 31 with dementia, including, but not limited to, neurologists,

- 1 geriatricians, and direct care workers;
- 2 (c) Dementia-specific training requirements for public and private
- 3 employees who interact with people living with Alzheimer's disease or
- 4 other dementia which shall include, but not be limited to, long-term care
- 5 workers, case managers, adult protective services, law enforcement, and
- 6 first responders;
- 7 (d) Home and community-based services, including respite care for
- 8 <u>individuals exhibiting symptoms of Alzheimer's disease or other dementia</u>
- 9 and their families;
- 10 (e) Quality care measures for home and community-based services and
- 11 residential care facilities; and
- 12 <u>(f) State-supported Alzheimer's disease and other dementia research</u>
- 13 <u>conducted at universities located in this state; and</u>
- 14 (3) Policies and strategies that address the following:
- 15 (a) Increasing public awareness of Alzheimer's disease and other
- 16 dementia;
- 17 (b) Educating providers to increase early detection and diagnosis of
- 18 Alzheimer's disease and other dementia;
- 19 (c) Improving the health care received by individuals diagnosed with
- 20 Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;
- 21 (d) Evaluating the capacity of the health care system in meeting the
- 22 growing number and needs of those with Alzheimer's disease and other
- 23 dementia;
- 24 (e) Increasing the number of health care professionals necessary to
- 25 treat the growing aging and Alzheimer's disease and dementia populations;
- 26 <u>(f) Improving services provided in the home and community to delay</u>
- 27 and decrease the need for institutionalized care for individuals with
- 28 Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;
- 29 (g) Improving long-term care, including assisted living, for those
- 30 with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;
- 31 (h) Assisting unpaid Alzheimer's disease or dementia caregivers;

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1 (i) Increasing and improving research on Alzheimer's disease and

- 2 other dementia;
- 3 (j) Promoting activities to maintain and improve brain health;
- 4 (k) Improving the collection of data and information related to
- 5 Alzheimer's disease and other dementia and the resulting public health
- 6 burdens;
- 7 (1) Improving public safety and addressing the safety-related needs
- 8 of those with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;
- 9 (m) Addressing legal protections for, and legal issues faced by,
- 10 individuals with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; and
- (n) Improving the ways in which the government evaluates and adopts
- 12 policies to assist individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or
- 13 <u>other dementia and their families.</u>
- 14 Sec. 7. (1)(a) No later than eighteen months after the effective
- 15 date of this act, the council shall compile their findings and
- 16 recommendations and submit them as a State Alzheimer's Plan to the
- 17 Legislature and the Governor.
- 18 (b) Every four years thereafter, the council shall issue an updated
- 19 State Alzheimer's Plan addressing the items in sections 5 and 6 of this
- 20 act and any other issues the council deems necessary and relevant toward
- 21 <u>addressing Alzheimer's disease and dementia in Nebraska.</u>
- 22 (2) By October 1 of each year after the creation of the State
- 23 Alzheimer's Plan, the council shall submit to the Legislature and the
- 24 Governor an annual report on the status of implementation of the State
- 25 Alzheimer's Plan recommendations and any barriers to implementation.
