- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to juveniles; to prohibit use of deception in
- 2 questioning juveniles; to prohibit admission of certain evidence;
- 3 and to define terms.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) A peace officer interviewing, questioning, or
- 2 interrogating a juvenile in connection with an investigation of an act
- 3 that, if committed by an adult, would constitute a crime, shall not use
- 4 <u>deception</u>.
- 5 (2) A statement made by a juvenile as a result of a violation of
- 6 this section shall not be admissible as evidence against the juvenile in
- 7 any criminal or juvenile court proceeding.
- 8 (3) For purposes of this section:
- 9 <u>(a) Deception means intentionally and knowingly:</u>
- 10 (i) Communicating false facts about the evidence in a case; or
- 11 (ii) Representing or communicating facts, information, or statements
- 12 <u>to a juvenile regarding leniency in arrest, prosecution, or disposition</u>
- 13 for such juvenile if the juvenile makes certain statements or admissions
- 14 <u>during an interview, a questioning, or an interrogation;</u>
- 15 (b) Juvenile means any person under eighteen years of age; and
- 16 <u>(c) Statement means any verbal, written, or sign-language</u>
- 17 communication.
