**LEGISLATIVE BILL 965**

Introduced by Bostar, 29.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to holidays; to amend sections 25-2221 and  
2 62-301, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to change  
3 provisions relating to holidays; and to repeal the original  
4 sections.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 25-2221, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
2 2020, is amended to read:

3 25-2221 Except as may be otherwise more specifically provided, the  
4 period of time within which an act is to be done in any action or  
5 proceeding shall be computed by excluding the day of the act, event, or  
6 default after which the designated period of time begins to run. The last  
7 day of the period so computed shall be included unless it is a Saturday,  
8 a Sunday, or a day during which the offices of courts of record may be  
9 legally closed as provided in this section, in which event the period  
10 shall run until the end of the next day on which the office will be open.

11 All courts and their offices may be closed on Saturdays, Sundays,  
12 days on which a specifically designated court is closed by order of the  
13 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and these holidays: New Year's Day,  
14 January 1; Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., the third Monday in  
15 January; President's Day, the third Monday in February; Arbor Day, the  
16 last Friday in April in each odd-numbered year and the first Tuesday  
17 following the first Monday in November in each even-numbered year;  
18 Memorial Day, the last Monday in May; Independence Day, July 4; Labor  
19 Day, the first Monday in September; Indigenous Peoples' Day and Columbus  
20 Day, the second Monday in October; Veterans Day, November 11;  
21 Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November; the day after  
22 Thanksgiving; Christmas Day, December 25; and all days declared by law or  
23 proclamation of the Governor to be holidays. Such days shall be  
24 designated as nonjudicial days. If any such holiday falls on Sunday, the  
25 following Monday shall be a holiday. If any such holiday falls on  
26 Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be a holiday. Court services shall  
27 be available on all other days. If the date designated by the state for  
28 observance of any legal holiday pursuant to this section, except Veterans  
29 Day, is different from the date of observance of such holiday pursuant to  
30 a federal holiday schedule, the federal holiday schedule shall be  
31 observed.

1           Sec. 2. Section 62-301, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
2 2020, is amended to read:

3           62-301 (1) For the purposes of the Uniform Commercial Code and  
4 section 62-301.01, the following days shall be holidays: New Year's Day,  
5 January 1; Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., the third Monday in  
6 January; President's Day, the third Monday in February; Arbor Day, the  
7 last Friday in April in each odd-numbered year and the first Tuesday  
8 following the first Monday in November in each even-numbered year;  
9 Memorial Day, the last Monday in May; Independence Day, July 4; Labor  
10 Day, the first Monday in September; Indigenous Peoples' Day and Columbus  
11 Day, the second Monday in October; Veterans Day, November 11, and the  
12 federally recognized holiday therefor, or either of them; Thanksgiving  
13 Day, the fourth Thursday in November; the day after Thanksgiving; and  
14 Christmas Day, December 25. If any such holiday falls on Sunday, the  
15 following Monday shall be a holiday. If the date designated by the state  
16 for observance of any legal holiday enumerated in this section, except  
17 Veterans Day, is different from the date of observance of such holiday  
18 pursuant to a federal holiday schedule, the federal holiday schedule  
19 shall be observed.

20           (2) Any bank doing business in this state may, by a brief written  
21 notice at, on, or near its front door, fully dispense with or restrict,  
22 to such extent as it may determine, the hours within which it will be  
23 open for business.

24           (3) Any bank may close on Saturday if it states such fact by a brief  
25 written notice at, on, or near its front door. When such bank will, in  
26 observance of such a notice, not be open for general business, such day  
27 shall, with respect to the particular bank, be the equivalent of a  
28 holiday as fully as if such day were listed in subsection (1) of this  
29 section, and any act authorized, required, or permitted to be performed  
30 at, by, or with respect to such bank which will, in observance of such  
31 notice, not be open for general business, acting in its own behalf or in

1 any capacity whatever, may be performed on the next succeeding business  
2 day and no liability or loss of rights on the part of any person shall  
3 result from such delay.

4 (4) Any bank which, by the notice provided for by subsection (3) of  
5 this section, has created the holiday for such bank may, without  
6 destroying the legal effect of the holiday for it and solely for the  
7 convenience of its customers, remain open all or part of such day in a  
8 limited fashion by treating every transaction with its customers on such  
9 day as though the transaction had taken place immediately upon the  
10 opening of such bank on the first following business day.

11 (5) Whenever the word bank is used in this section it includes  
12 building and loan association, savings and loan association, credit  
13 union, savings bank, trust company, investment company, and any other  
14 type of financial institution.

15 Sec. 3. Original sections 25-2221 and 62-301, Revised Statutes  
16 Cumulative Supplement, 2020, are repealed.
