Sec. 6. Section 32-304, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 3 2022, is amended to read:

14 32-304 (1) The Secretary of State in conjunction with the Department 15 of Motor Vehicles shall implement a registration application process which may be used statewide to register to vote and update voter 16 17 registration records electronically using the Secretary of State's website. An applicant who has a valid Nebraska motor vehicle operator's 18 license or state identification card may use the application process to 19 20 register to vote or to update his or her voter registration record with 21 changes in his or her personal information or other information related 22 to his or her eligibility to vote. For each electronic application, the 23 Secretary of State shall obtain a copy of the electronic representation 24 of the applicant's digital image and signature from the Department of Motor Vehicles' records of his or her motor vehicle operator's license or 25 26 state identification card for purposes of voter registration, and 27 electronic poll books, and voting.

(2) The application shall contain substantially all the information
 provided in section 32-312 and the following informational statements:

30 (a) An applicant who submits this application electronically is31 affirming that the information in the application is true. Any applicant

The penalty for 4 a Class IV felony is up to two years imprisonment and twelve months post-5 release supervision, a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both;

6 (b) An applicant who submits this application electronically is 7 agreeing to the use of his or her digital signature from the Department 8 of Motor Vehicles' records of his or her motor vehicle operator's license 9 or state identification card for purposes of voter registration;

10 (c) To vote at the polling place on election day, the completed 11 application must be submitted on or before the third Friday before the 12 election and prior to midnight on such Friday; and

(d) The election commissioner or county clerk will, upon receipt of
the application for registration, send an acknowledgment of registration
