- 3 Section 1. Section 81-12,146, Cumulative Revised Statutes
- Supplement, 2022, is amended to read: 4
- 5 81-12,146 (1) The Site and Building Development Fund is created. The
- 6 fund shall receive money pursuant to section 76-903 and may include
- 7 revenue from transfers by the Legislature, grants, private contributions,
- repayment of loans, and all other sources. The Department of Economic 8
- Development, as part of its comprehensive business development strategy, 9
- shall administer the fund. Any money in the fund available for investment 10
- shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the 11
- 12 Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment
- 13 Act.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to transfer five million 14
- dollars from the General Fund to the Site and Building Development Fund 15
- for fiscal year 2022-23 and five million dollars from the General Fund to 16
- the Site and Building Development Fund for fiscal year 2023-24. Such 17
- money shall be placed in a subaccount of the Site and Building 18
- Development Fund and earmarked for use to fund large shovel-ready 19
- 20 commercial and industrial sites developed under the Municipal Inland Port
- 21 Authority Act.
- (3)(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate five 22
- hundred thousand dollars from the Site and Building Development Fund for 23
- 24 fiscal year 2024-25 to the department to enter into one or more contracts
- to conduct a comprehensive study or studies to identify and evaluate 25
- large commercial and industrial sites in Nebraska that have the potential 26
- 27 to attract major investment and employment opportunities. The study shall

1 include consideration of super sites that encompass between five hundred

- 2 and one thousand acres and mega sites that encompass more than one
- 3 thousand acres. At least one proposed site shall be located west of the
- 4 one hundredth meridian in Nebraska. The contracts shall be awarded based
- 5 <u>on a competitive selection process as determined by the department. The</u>
- 6 <u>studies shall be completed no later than December 15, 2024.</u>
- 7 (b) The study shall assess the potential geographic locations; the
- 8 infrastructure assets that would be required for each site, including
- 9 highway, rail, and air transportation, and utilities such as water,
- 10 wastewater treatment, electrical power, and natural gas; the population
- 11 <u>within fifty miles of each site and whether such population would be</u>
- 12 <u>sufficient to provide an adequate workforce for such site; and the</u>
- 13 appropriate level of state investment necessary to position Nebraska as a
- 14 <u>nationally or globally competitive location for site selection targeting</u>
- 15 various sectors, including, but not limited to, advanced manufacturing,
- 16 trade, bioscience, agribusiness, warehousing and supply chain logistics,
- 17 <u>technology</u>, <u>aerospace</u>, <u>automotive</u>, <u>clean energy</u>, <u>military support</u>, <u>and</u>
- 18 life sciences. Such identified state investment levels may include, but
- 19 <u>are not limited to, land acquisition costs and infrastructure</u>
- 20 <u>investments</u>. The purpose of the study is to provide strategic insights
- 21 <u>that will enable the state to attract major investment and employment</u>
- 22 <u>opportunities in order to support the growth of transformational</u>
- 23 <u>industries within Nebraska.</u>
- 24 (c) The Director of Economic Development shall appoint an advisory
- 25 committee comprised of representatives of Nebraska economic development
- 26 <u>organizations</u>, <u>equally representing each of Nebraska's three</u>
- 27 <u>congressional districts, to assist the department in identifying the</u>
- 28 <u>location of potential and preferred super sites and mega sites.</u>
