Dear Members of the Legislature:

According to the provision of *Section 39-1392*, *R.R.S 1998*, NDOT is submitting the One-Year and Five-Year Programs of anticipated design, construction, maintenance, and improvements for our State's recreation roads. This includes exterior access roads as well as interior service roads.

Section 39-1392, R.R.S. 1998 provides that only projects that are certified by the Game and Parks Commission may be included in the Recreation Road One-Year and Five-Year Programs. The attached program and projects do comply with that provision.

The following documents are attached for your review:

- 1) One (1) Year Program (for calendar year 2024): This report includes both certified (capital improvement) and maintenance (resurfacing and restoration) projects anticipated for the next calendar year.
- 2) Five (5) Year Certified Program (for calendar years 2025 through 2028): This is a report of anticipated resurfacing and restoration projects/capital improvement projects which have been identified and certified by the Game and Parks Commission. Many of these projects have not yet been programmed.
- 3) <u>Certified Recreation Road Construction Plan:</u> This is a long-term listing of capital improvement priorities, as identified by the Game and Parks Commission.
- 4) <u>Financial Status of the Recreation Road Fund Fund Number 2672:</u> This report shows the current and future financial status of the State Recreation Road Fund, as reported by our Controller Division.
- 5) <u>Project Letting Lists for 2021, 2022 and 2023:</u> This report includes recreation road projects let to contract during the current year, as well as the two previous calendar years. It includes both certified and maintenance projects.

The Department of Transportation pays close attention to resurfacing, restoring, and maintaining the State's existing recreation roads. After annual inspections, we prioritize the required maintenance projects, carefully considering the condition of each road and the available recreation road funding. Our One (1) Year Program for recreation road currently identifies an estimated \$11 million of needs.

As you can see, the estimated cost for the projects shown in the Five (5) Year Certified Program alone greatly exceeds the anticipated fund accrual during the same period, based upon approximately \$4 million per year accruing into the Recreation Road Fund. This capital improvement plan will change as maintenance needs arise and the priorities of the Game and Parks Commission shift. We work diligently to balance these capital improvement goads with the maintenance needs of our existing recreation roads.

The Department of Transportation wishes to acknowledge excellent cooperation from the Game and Parks Commission during the planning, design, and construction of these important projects.

Nebraska State Highway Commission Policy SRR Funding for Garfield and Loup Road Resolution No. 2023-1

WHEREAS, The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGP) has authority to designate certain recreation area interior service roads and exterior access roads as eligible for roadway surfacing or resurfacing projects with State Recreation Road (SRR) Funding under Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 39-1390.

WHEREAS, NGP has designated a route as eligible for SRR funding, and the Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) has statutory authority to design and construct such roadway.

WHEREAS, the designated route is an existing paved county road beginning in Garfield County just east of the Virginia Smith Dam at the Calamus Reservoir and continuing west across the top of the dam and into Loup County for a couple miles.

WHEREAS, Although the designated route is eligible for SRR funding, NDOT believes the roadway would not meet the requirements of a major arterial, and as such NDOT recommends the roadway not be added to the State Highway System after the project.

WHEREAS, Section 39-1390 requires State Highway Commission action when NDOT recommends that a roadway eligible for SRR funding should not be added to the State Highway System.

WHEREAS, NDOT hereby requests a formal resolution of the Nebraska State Highway Commission agreeing with the recommendation of NDOT that the subject roadway will not be added to the State Highway System after completion of the SRR funded project.

WHEREAS, The State Highway Commission has authority under Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 39-1390 to make this determination.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 39-1390, the Nebraska State Highway Commission hereby agrees with the recommendation of NDOT and determines that the roadway described above shall not be added to the State Highway System after completion of the proposed SRR project.
