## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 81-1850 provides certain notification responsibilities to victims for county attorneys, Board of Parole, Department of Correctional Services, county corrections, Department of Health and Human Services, and the Board of Pardons. The responsibilities generally apply to felonies and there are enhanced responsibilities for certain offenses.

LB1159 would add additional offenses to the list of offenses that require enhanced notification. These offenses are: manslaughter, motor vehicle homicide, first degree false imprisonment, assault by strangulation or suffocation, first or second degree domestic assault, child enticement by means of an electronic communication device, sexual abuse by a school employee, sexual abuse of a protected individual, terroristic threats, sex trafficking, and labor trafficking.
