Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The bill would amend section 58-201 of the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority Act (Act), as well add two new sections to the Act. The bill would provide, section by section, as follows:

Section 1 amends section 58-201 to include Section 2 within the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority Act.

Section 2 defines Olmstead Plan as used in Section 2. It also requires the authority to use its best efforts to obtain state and federal grants for the purpose of building safe, affordable, and accessible housing for individuals with disabilities, and requires the authority to collaborate with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) in obtaining such grants.

Section 3 defines Olmstead Plan as used in Section 3. It also requires the Department of Economic Development (DED) to

use its best efforts to obtain state and federal grants for the purpose of building safe, affordable, and accessible housing for individuals with disabilities, and requires the DED to collaborate with DHHS in obtaining such grants.

Section 4 states that the Revisor of Statutes shall assign Section 3 to Chapter 81, article 12.

Section 5 repeals the original section being amended.
