Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 33 would allow the mayor of a first or second class city to vote on any matter which requires a majority vote of the city council. This may occur if the mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence. LB33 does not allow the mayor to vote when a super-majority vote of the council is required.

Section-by-Section Summary:

Section 1 of the bill amends 16-312 to allow the mayor of a first class city to vote on any matter which requires a majority vote of the city council if the mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence.

Section 2 of the bill amends 16-404 to allow mayors of a first class city to vote in matters of appropriation if the

mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence. Requirements of providing the election commissioner or county clerk written notice when requesting adjustments of election district boundaries are removed.

Section 3 amends 16-503 to allow mayors of a first class city to vote in matters of contracting or accepting work done under contract if the mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence.

Section 4 amends 17-110 to allow mayors of a second class city to vote on any matter which requires a majority vote of the city council if the mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence.

Section 5 amends 17-614 to allow mayors of a second class city to vote in matters of appropriation if the mayor's vote is required due to the council being equally divided or a majority cannot be reached due to absence.

Section 6 of the bill repeals original sections.
