# Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 630 would require each school district to adopt a written dress code and grooming policy that is consistent with the model policy developed by the DOE.

#### SECTION 1

Within the dates provided the school board of each district shall adopt a written dress and grooming policy that is consistent with the DOE model policy.

The adopted policy shall conform with standards provided in this bill regarding subjects such as remedial measures, missing class time, and enforcement.

## **SECTION 2**

2.1 - Addresses definitions and use of terms such as:

Department

National Origin

Natural and Protective Hairstyles

Race

Religious Attire

Tribal Regalia

- 2.2 Instructs the DOE to develop and distribute a model dress code by December 2, 2024. Sub-sections a, b, and c address certain prohibitions in the model dress code.
- 2.3 The model policy must include a statement specifying consistency with a school's overall discipline plan.
- 2.4 The DOE may, as part of the dress code and grooming policy, adopt a health and safety standard. Such standard and its enforcement must comport with requirements included in subsection 2.4.a through 2.4.f.
