Under current law, application for compensation under the Nebraska Crime Victim's Reparation Act must be submitted within two years of the injury suffered as a result of a crime that was reported to police within three days. Section 1 of LB757 would amend § 81-1821 to extend the three days to five days and extend the statute of limitations for victims under age 19. Applications for victims under 19 must be

submitted within three years of the victim's death or 19th birthday.
