- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
- 2 sections 60-6,279 and 60-6,282, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2023;
- 3 to change provisions relating to protective helmets; to eliminate
- 4 obsolete provisions; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
- 5 original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 60-6,279, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2023, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 60-6,279 (1) A person shall not operate or be a passenger on a
- 4 motorcycle or moped on any highway in this state unless such person is:
- 5 (a) Wearing a protective helmet of the type and design manufactured
- 6 for use by operators of such vehicles and unless such helmet is secured
- 7 properly on the user's head with a chin strap while the vehicle is in
- 8 motion. All such protective helmets shall be designed to reduce injuries
- 9 to the user resulting from head impacts and shall be designed to protect
- 10 the user by remaining on the user's head, deflecting blows, resisting
- 11 penetration, and spreading the force of impact. Each such helmet shall
- 12 consist of lining, padding, and chin strap and shall meet or exceed the
- 13 standards established in the United States Department of Transportation's
- 14 Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 218, 49 C.F.R. 571.218, for
- 15 motorcycle helmets; or
- 16 (b) Beginning January 1, 2024:
- 17 $\underline{(b)(i)}$ (i) At least twenty-one years of age; and
- 18 (ii)(A) A resident of Nebraska who received his or her Class M
- 19 license prior to May 1, 2024, and has completed the Motorcycle Safety
- 20 Foundation three-hour Basic eCourse and submitted proof of such
- 21 <u>completion to the Department of Motor Vehicles. Proof of such completion</u>
- 22 shall be in a manner approved by the department;
- (B) A $\frac{(ii)(A)}{(ii)(A)}$ For a resident of Nebraska who received his or her
- 24 <u>Class M license on or after May 1, 2024, and has completed the basic</u>
- 25 motorcycle safety course as provided in the Motorcycle Safety Education
- 26 Act and submitted proof of such completion to the Department of Motor
- 27 Vehicles. Proof of such completion shall be in a manner approved by the
- 28 department; or
- 29 <u>(C) A (B) For a</u> nonresident of Nebraska<u>.</u> , has completed an
- 30 equivalent to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation basic motorcycle rider
- 31 course or some other substantially similar motorcycle rider course

- 1 approved by the state of the person's residence and provides proof of
- 2 such completion to a law enforcement officer upon request.
- 3 (2) A person shall not be a passenger on a motorcycle or moped on
- 4 any highway in this state unless:
- 5 (a) Such person is wearing a protective helmet described in
- 6 <u>subdivision (1)(a) of this section; or</u>
- 7 (b) The person operating the motorcycle or moped is a person
- 8 <u>described in subdivision (1)(b) of this section.</u>
- 9 (3) (2) The Department of Motor Vehicles shall modify the existing
- 10 system of the department by January 1, 2024, to allow the date of
- 11 completion of such course to be recorded on the person's record provided
- 12 for in section 60-483.
- 13 (4) (3) A person shall not operate a motorcycle or moped on any
- 14 highway in this state unless such person employs one of the following
- 15 forms of eye protection: (a) Glasses that cover the orbital region of the
- 16 person's face, (b) a protective face shield attached to a protective
- 17 helmet, (c) goggles, or (d) a windshield on the motorcycle or moped that
- 18 protects the operator's and passenger's horizontal line of vision in all
- 19 operating positions.
- 20 Sec. 2. Section 60-6,282, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2023, is
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 60-6,282 (1) Until December 31, 2023, a person who violates section
- 23 60-6,279 shall be quilty of a traffic infraction and shall be fined fifty
- 24 dollars.
- 25 (2) Beginning January 1, 2024:
- 26 (1) $\frac{1}{2}$ A person violating any provision of subsection (1), (2), or
- 27 (4) or (3) of section 60-6,279 shall be guilty of an infraction as
- 28 defined in section 29-431 and shall be fined two hundred fifty dollars
- 29 for each violation.
- 30 (2) (b) Enforcement of subsection (1), (2), or (4) or (3) of section
- 31 60-6,279 shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when an

- 1 operator of a motorcycle or moped has been cited or charged with a
- 2 violation or some other offense unless the violation involves a person
- 3 under the age of eighteen years riding on any portion of the motorcycle
- 4 or moped not designed or intended for the use of passengers when the
- 5 motorcycle or moped is in motion.
