- 10 Sec. 3. <u>Palliative care means specialized medical care for people</u>
- 11 living with a serious illness that carries a high risk of mortality or
- 12 <u>negatively impacts quality of life. This type of care addresses the</u>
- 13 symptoms and stress of a serious illness, including pain. Palliative care
- 14 <u>is a team-based approach to care, providing essential support at any age</u>
- 15 and stage of a serious illness. It can be provided across care settings
- 16 and along with curative treatment. The goal of palliative care is to
- 17 improve quality of life for both the patient and the patient's family or
- 18 care partner.
