1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend 2 sections 38-2102, 38-2103, and 38-2120, Reissue Revised Statutes of 3 Nebraska, and sections 38-121, 38-2101, 38-2104, 38-2116, 38-2117, 4 38-2121, 38-2122, 38-2124, 38-2130, and 38-2139, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change provisions of the Mental 5 6 Health Practice Act to include protections and requirements for 7 certified art therapists; to define terms; to change the membership 8 of the Board of Mental Health Practice; to provide powers and duties 9 to the Board of Mental Health Practice; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the original sections. 10
