The HHS Committee utilizes the listed reports to oversee the progress of the Department of Health and Human Services in implementing the recommendations the HHS Committee made in Legislative Resolution 37, One Hundred Second Legislature, First Session, 2011. In addition to the reports provided by the Department of Health and Human Services, the Child Welfare Reports Status list also includes the status of reports provided to the HHS Committee from the Nebraska Inspector General for Child Welfare, the Foster Care Review Office, the Child Advocacy Centers, the Office of Juvenile Services, the State Child Death Review Team and the Nebraska Children's Commission.

The HHS Committee continues to monitor the progress of child welfare through a variety of mechanisms including the attached reports, legislative hearings, and briefings. Towards that end, the HHS Committee will hold a hearing on January 9, 2013 at 1:30 to be briefed by Thomas Pristow (Director the Children and Family Services), Julie Rogers (Nebraska Inspector General of Child Welfare), Kim Hawekotte (Director of the Foster Care Review Office) and Karen Authier (Chairperson of the Nebraska Children's Commission). The purpose of the briefing is to:

- Review with the testifiers the various reports issued by their Office/Commission;
- Receive an update of current activities of their Office/Commission;
- Discuss from their perspectives any "red flags", challenges and positive outcomes of the child welfare system; and
- Be apprised of plans regarding future activities by their Office/Commission.

Thank you for your continued partnership as all three branches of state government, community officials, providers and stakeholders work together to continue improving the child welfare system and meeting the need of the children of Nebraska.
