Dear Senator Lethrop:

This is in regard to your letter to long-term segregation inmates, dated August 18, 2014, and the enclosed survey. I am in receipt of both. Thank you.

As I understand it, the chief purpose of your committee is to investigate the circumstances surrounding the Nikko Jenkins matter, including the role that long-term administrative segregation may have played. Everyone seems to understand that long-term segregation may have played a role. In addition, I see that some wonder whether Jenkins may not have received

adequate mental health treatment and think that inadequate mental health treatment played a role.

The untold story regarding Nikko Jenkins and all other long-term seg inmates, most of whom are on Administrative Confinement (AC) status, is: (1) who and what DES Mental Health is; and (2) the role DES Mental Health plays in administrative segregation.

Most people think that the chief purpose of DES Mental Health is to provide inmates with treatment -- that they are basically social workers. This is definitely NOT the case.

While there are some severely cognitively low functioning inmates who do fall under Mental Health's supervision, this is an extremely small part of what Mental Health does, a very minor role.

The prime directive of DES Mental Health is to assess inmates' likelihood of reoffending and to determine their threat level, both within the institution and after their release. They gather information about inmates, determine / <sup>(predict)</sup> predict whether they pose some

Sort of threat, then they both recommend how the inmate be classified and reclassified and they participate in the classification and reclassification decisions, all of which determines whether the inmates gets, for example, work release and parole.

And they do both. They make recommendations to the Classification Committees; and they are then actually members of the Classification Committees that make the actual decisions at all three levels: the unit level (Unit Classification Committees), the institutional level (the Institutional Classification Committees), and the Departmental level (usually the Director's Review Committee). First they make recommendations, then they are actually voting members of ~~the~~ all the various Classification ~~author~~ <sup>ities</sup> that make the decisions.

The clinical psychologist supervisor of each Facility (all Facilities have one) is basically a police lieutenant. The licensed mental health practitioners <sup>(LMHPs)</sup> who make contact with inmates are basically detectives. They compile information on the inmates at that facility. Each inmate's case is like one big ongoing investigation. The documents the process, which are placed in the

inmates' Mental Health Files, read just like police reports

The inmates don't know any of this. They think that Mental Health is here for crazy people or for people who are very stressed out. Inmates think Mental Health workers are secret workers that are disconnected from the classification/reclassification process. They don't understand that Mental Health will not hesitate to label someone "dangerous" in the same way that criminal control uses a label "biting dog." Many inmates say crazy things to LMP's at exit threateningly just to get Mental Health's attention. They don't understand that Mental Health will make a permanent record of it and use it against them.

This is not what the term "mental health care" means in the community.

DCS Mental Health is a security service that is acting undercover and passing itself off as ~~secret~~ health care workers in order to get info on inmates. How would you feel if your character secretly reported on you to the Police?

This is not how mental health care is provided in the community.

This brings me to DES Mental Health's role in the long-term administrative segregation process.

A LMAP sits on the Segregation Unit's unit classification committee that first initiates administrative seg (e.g., placar inmate on AC), then later conducts the physical reviews of the inmate, then later votes to continue the inmate on Admin Seg, maybe indefinitely. Generally the same person who LMAP who participates in unit classification committee activities is ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> one who conducts Segregation Mental Health Status Reviews in which a MH staff goes to the inmate's seg cell door for a couple minutes and interacts with the inmate through a closed door. It's all just a rubberstamp to say "Fine. Continue on Seg Status." It's a Rubberstamp.

At the Institutional level (the Inmate Classification Committee), the Clinical Psychologist Supervisor of the facility tells the warden what to do, to keep the gun on seg. Do you really think a warden is

going to do otherwise when a Ph.D. is telling him that keeping the inmate in Seg 15 is the risk-free decision?

At the Departmental level, at least two Ph.D.'s who are clinical psychologists are there telling the Director's people the same thing; the safe decision is to let the inmate continue in Seg. 15.

This is not what receiving mental health care means in the community.

The Nebraska Correctional Health Care Services Act clearly states that the Community Standard of care for mental health care must be met, and that DES must provide the care.

I think that DES is breaking and preventing the law. ~~DES~~ <sup>DES Mental Health</sup> is a secret police security apparatus that violates the Neb. Cor. Health Care Services Act.

I think it's very possible that Mike Jenkins did whatever he did because DES kept him on administrative Seg for many years, and because DES Mental Health committed it from when he was.

Randy T. Kohl, M.D., DES's Deputy Director of Healthcare Services. Dr. Kohl oversees Medical and Behavioral Health. He is in charge of healthcare.

Cameron White, Ph.D., DES's Behavioral Health Administrator. Dr. White is in charge of Mental Health, psychiatric services, and substance abuse services. He answers directly to Dr. Kohl.

Mark Weilage, Ph.D., DES's Assistant Behavioral Health Administrator for Mental Health. Dr. Weilage is in charge of Mental Health for the Department. He answers directly to Dr. White.

These are the DES people in charge of mental health care, and who also play a very major role in DES's administrative segregation system. They recommend it and rubberstamp it. Please question them.

Additional Comments regarding segregation status: My main problem is this. I was forced to come into protective custody because I got out of the gang life and now, because I am in P.C. and because the programs recommended by the administration are in order for me to get out on parole are unavailable to P.C. inmates, I am forced to join my whole number. A lot of people in P.C. are dealing with the same issue. Some people were targeted by predators on the yard, some people were picked on just because of their appearance. In P.C., we are not on any kind of disciplinary status whatsoever, it is supposed to be a place of safety for those who are persecuted by other inmates. But if you have to go to P.C. then that means, for those who have any programs to take, that you have to do your whole number because they don't have the programs available for us. If we're not on any disciplinary status and we're under the state's protection, then how come they don't provide for us the right for us to take the same very programs that they insist we take? We are not being uncooperative or defiant, but are more than willing to do what is required by law.

I have received none. I have been ~~diagnosed~~ diagnosed with: Border PTSD, Depression, Social Anxiety, acute paranoia, and A.D.H.D. I am being given no treatment or help of any kind. I understand that something is wrong with my mental health, that's why I've asked for help. When I was at JSC I was continuously mistreated and received not treatment or help. Since being at NSP I was intentionally let on the gallery with another segregation inmate and assaulted. Staff knew I had problems with that particular inmate. The more often I insist that I need help, the more I am mistreated. Currently I am on multiple restrictions. I have no mattress, no clothes, am only given (4) four squares of toilet paper a shift. I am on Nutrilock. PM 8:27 AM I was shot with pepper balls and sprayed with chemical spray while I was in shackles. I was punched several times and kicked too. Since I ~~was~~ <sup>was</sup> ~~asked~~ <sup>asked</sup> that day staff continuously harass and antagonize me and torture. I have been refused meals, toilet paper, and medications. I also am only able to use my glasses for (2) two hours a day. I have been striped naked on the gallery so that all inmates could see and make to grab my knees while inmates were taunting me and antagonizing me. I am only allowed (2) two security blankets and a smock to sleep with in a very very cold cell. Staff and inmates have been making threats on mine and my family's safety. Since being at NSP staff have never done their 30 minute gallery checks. The only way to verify this is to review the cameras in the control unit because they have lied and said they do 30 minute checks on their own work. I have also been refused medical treatment because I am in segregation.

There are things that would help people keep their sanity in seg, give people their photo albums and C.D.s, give them yard a day 7 days a week, little things go along way, let people have more than 5 books in their cell give us a shower more than 3 days out of the week, allow us regular pens - color pencils. These are not things we should have to earn - 3 showers a week ??? That's wrong.

After 45 days of my initial Administrative Confinement classification the Unit Team Recommended my release from seg. the Institution shot me down mainly because of my <sup>IM</sup> bistro, not the incident.

Set a limit on A/C time, a definite date from the date they start A/C, when people come to seg and get A/C or IM'd they don't have a set time limit all they know is it'll be for - months - maybe a year and in extreme cases years so they snap one of <sup>three</sup> ways, one get really violent and as a consequence more years in seg. (once on A/C or IM almost any misconduct report, minor or major will keep you there longer on that status) or lose it and off themselves (suicide) or they'll be like me violent and socially awkward unable to hold normal conversation speaking fast and incoherently or shy and unable to talk, they all have health problems due to improper foot wear and not enough activity →

They took seg. inmates shoes in "08" because an inmate hanged himself in Tecumseh, what they don't tell you is that that particular inmate told staff he was gonna kill himself they did not believe him and because of him constantly threatening to kill himself they never checked on him until latter and he was dead since then three more people (all three of them I know personally) killed themselves. — So the Institution says the reason we can't have our shoe because of the laces well I can do the same thing with a sheet or even twisted toilet paper (yes it close work). We need our shoes, I've got arthritis in my knees - siatica because of improper footwear.

Back to the Photo album and C.D thing real quick — the institution says that they don't have the time and means to send your photo albums and pictures and that you must get any pictures via the U.S. mail because pictures are not priority, well I beg to differ, pictures to me hold sentimental value so they are a priority for keeping a person sane at least to some degree, C.D's is said to pose a security risk because you can make a weapon with it. But from my knowledge in 11 years none has done that. When anyone is sent to seg. they receive their Bible or Quas Glasses and shower shoes sometimes a cup so what is hard about photo albums and pictures, and why only the limit of 12?

Negative ~~and~~ actions are used against the inmates, but when an inmate works the Transformation Project & Refrains from Misconduct, it is overlooked. The staff, while I feel they make the best out of a difficult situation, ~~and~~ properly Penalize Negative Behavior, but don't Reward Positive Behaviors.

I also feel like Administrators are Too Quick to use the term "Threat to the Safety and Security of the Institution" to justify placement on Segregation. It is a very loose term. It is their "Be all, to End All," go to reasoning, when classifying an inmate to a segregated status. Once they use this term, ~~and~~ an inmate is for all intents and purposes, Warehoused ~~and~~ for an Indefinite amount of Time, with No considerations to an Inmate's Personalized Plan, Needed Programming or Participation in Programs prior to being Placed on Segregation. ~~and~~ Personally, I've been eligible for Parole since 2/21/13. I was in R.T.C. when Placed in Segregation. When I saw the Parole Board in March, 2013, I was told I needed to complete R.T.C./S.A.U. to be considered for Parole. In May 2013 when I went up for Removal from A.C. I was denied because I am "A Threat to Safety & Security," even though I had Unit Support & Completed the Transformation Project & Obtained Zero M.I.R.'s.

The majority of Dept. employees care not to uphold law so that said Dept. employees can say the inmate is wrong. This type of behavior is widely accepted in segregation and not as bad in general population. The current unit manager David Skow is inefficient and ineffective as a unit manager. Mr. Skow releases inmates from segregation that have been in physical altercations just after 2 days but continues to house non-violent offenders in segregation for non-violent offenses for long periods of time working with Jonathan Lewis with the disciplinary committee to discriminate against certain inmates. 60 days disciplinary isolation with two months loss of good time for partially filling out a receipt for grievances (name, inmate no, etc. etc.)

Right now there is no punishment and everybody knows it. So I will be in protective custody for my 6 years, because I'm a nice guy. Most inmates dont have any understanding of why they're angry, extra sensitive to noise, or uncomfortable to human contact, especially from their "captors" (prison guards). Not to mention that staff use their "educated" mind to manipulate/belittle those of us that dont understand. Also, prison is over-populated and under-staffed, so theres no real way for inmates to get the actual help they need because how much time can mental health, medical, case managers, etc. actually spend with each inmate? without neglecting another inmate?

Not all inmates need mental health (the inmate helping me with this for example) or any special attention. But some need it are  
getting it

what every inmate needs is an education (GED/ESL/Diploma/etc), and vocational/technical skills, re-entry skills (typing/resume writing/job search/etc) and they need understanding and assurance that they can make it on the outside once they are released.

For those inmates who dont need mental-health/GED/ESL/etc, something should be made available for them also like: College courses, job skill building, etc. Staff that would allow them to continue to grow and expand their knowledge/skills instead of stagnating for years/decades only to be released with job skills/training thats out dated.

Everything about prison is against inmate success because society sent us here for punishment not success. Administration cant be pro-inmate, politicians cant either. And when an inmates claims to be rehabilitated, who's to say hes not lying in hopes to "play the system"? But, who's to say hes not telling the truth? The hard part is trust. Trust the Admin. to follow the rules/policy as to be fair to all involved and to hold staff accountable and to be fair to all inmates to dont follow the rules. Trust the inmates that are trying to change and to hold them accountable also.

There are many ideas as to how to change prison but one thing is certain, prisons cant continue down this path because it'll eventually consume itself. Just look at how NDCS is being torn apart because of incompetency over the last decade or

Right medication that will treat the disturbance rather than cause more damage. Some prescribed medicines may increase thoughts of suicide.

Additional Comments:

As a mentally ill prisoner, over the past 7 years I have been enduring and dealing with my depression of anxiety attacks, nervousness, and agitation. I have to disassociate myself from others as much as possible because alot of people don't understand mental illness. I've endured where some inmates have committed suicide. Many mentally ill prisoners can be doing ok, but how often are we triggered into some manic depression, sadness, anger, violence, felodese, anxiety attacks, bi-polar, ADHT, or schizzophrenia.

The prison officials are not trained to deal with this problem and so they treat us like animals. Prison officials are liable for harrassing and mentally torturing those of us where a numerous of complaints have been made against authorities for physical abuse of taking our legal mail and property and trashing it; Placing human feces in our food trays, providing wrong medication to trigger the mentally ill sufferer into going into a manic rage.

My friend Barbero Viltrez who had been my friend for more than 20 years killed himself about 2 years back because authorities took ]his legal mail and trashed it while he was litigating his criminal case. He became extremely depressed and hung himself in a cell and that too could have been prevented if they would have placed him in a place to deal with his mental issues.

The Administrators are the cause for alot of the mental breakdowns and could care less if a prisoner is in his cell hanging they will just walk right by during their rounds. I've went to authorities for help in a situation where I was released from segregation status and was told to live with a white "supremist and devil worshipper" I was told by the c.o. to "fight or flight!" ultimately I was punished and sent back to segregation status.

The Administrators or very aware of each inmates file and yet they could care less of the safety and security of their own fellow employees who have been viciously attacked by violent convicts. They will allow them to return to general population or society at large without giving them the rehabilitaion so needed and this has been the case of "Nikki Jenkins" and many others.

I was punished by prison officials because I was told by a staff that I am not an "Afrikan" and that I am a "Negroe" and not to be speaking my "Afrikan" language. I was written up.

I FILED a law suit, me and another convict against DCS and having been working in kitchen for 2 years, now I am prohibited from working by the authority of the associate warden.

DCS keeps me in an accrued debt for legal photocopying and I cannot even assess money to pay for hygiene, deodorant , soap, toothpaste. I have been physically assaulted by a sgt. and was told by staff that they will say this happen and no pictures should be taken of the blood. As a result i was punished and taken to seg and charged with self mutilation in which was dismissed.

my experience here as an inmate has been interesting in the Tecumseh Institution. As an institution I realize that there should be certain standards that apply... my visualization as an "institution": is designed for discipline, and in addition, correction. Many people think of discipline as a negative aspect. One should realize that discipline has many definitions such as... correction, mentoring, educating, etc... I understand your curiosity on the prison reform. This institution could use the above discipline/correctional programs as well as other adjustments... There's just not enough here... And I must say at the end of the day... "education" is key. Overall, the staff here isn't as bad, of course there are some that's in need of counseling themselves, but there are some good people... mental health, me personally I've never had any problems with

the staff or that area.. but I will say that the mental health staff could come around a bit more often and I guess be a little more social with inmates about the programs.

Before I close this letter I would like to say that Nikko was a childhood friend.. I have many stories to tell on that subject, but I'd save the next few lines for something more important.. I have ideas on how to prevent tragedies such as Nikko's case.. I would like to form a group or program that allows the inmates to correspond with inmates that are held in segregation. This committee would allow us as people to do our own investigation or outlooks on the status of inmates held in seg. As a committee this would allow us as inmates to correspond with each other to make sure that we are getting the treatment we need especially the ones in seg. that have no one to care for them. This would allow guys from seg. to request inmates of the committee

to correspond or respond to request complaints, and other arrangements that staff don't fulfill. This prevents many problems from happening such as the conflict I recently had with the staff. This conflict involved a violation of due process... a situation that involved a caseworker (Wiley) mishandling my appeal of my Seg. Status... mysteriously I + came up missing? an Inmate Committee could prevent that.

Anyway,

I do not either excuse or condone this violence, I just wish to point out the numbers & state that there may be a reason why such a small group of NDCS staff members have an inmate <sup>on staff</sup> assault rate of one third. Where there's smoke there's usually fire.

Again, the overall majority of NDCS staff are professional, helpful, caring & genuinely good people, but those that are not are ~~constructive~~ creating a situation in which resentment & rebellion reign rather than growth, maturation & rehabilitation.

Thank you for the opportunity to voice my concerns and observation. I will be sending this directly to you, Senator Lathrop. I do not trust that it will arrive if I obey the directive delivered on the sticker at the front of the envelope your office provided.

INEVITABLY, THE MENTAL DISEASE INSIDE TECUMSEH STATE PRISON CONSUMES THE VULNERABLE MINDS COMPLETELY AND HAS ITS EFFECTS ON THOSE STRONGER AND COMPETENT MINDS. NO AMOUNT OF LOVE OR MONEY CAN EVER REPLACE ONE'S LOST TIME OR SANITY. ODDLY, SOME OF THESE SAME PEOPLE RETURN BACK TO SOCIETY WITH NO REAL PLAN ON HOW TO COPE OR WITHSTAND EVEN THE SMALLEST PRESSURES. SADLY I HAVE WITNESSED PEOPLE DETERIORATE ON A DAILY BASIS WHILE IN SEGREGATION ON F-BLOCK. WHAT COULD HAVE BEEN A SHORT-TERM PRISON SENTENCE OFTEN ENDS UP A LIFETIME SCAR. BEING SEGREGATED WITH SEVERELY MENTALLY ILL INMATES HAS ALLOWED ME TO FULLY COMPREHEND MY GRANDMOTHER'S MANTRA OF "WHAT DOESN'T KILL US ONLY MAKES US STRONGER". BANGING ON CELL DOORS CREATES INSOMNIA, THE LIGHTS STAY ON ALL THE TIME AND SOME INMATES BECOME EXTREMELY DELUSIONAL. LONG TERM SEGREGATION WITHOUT ADEQUATE AND EFFECTIVE RESOURSE INCREASES THE RISK FOR INMATES TO DEVELOP EXTENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH DISORDERS AND PHYSICAL HEALTH PROBLEMS. Tennessee State Correctional Institute (TSCI) I received  
the survey letter & filled it out. I am not confident in  
all of the surveys getting to your committee, I myself  
have been experiencing, letters & grievances going missing  
& this is why I am writing thru the mail.

I am going to briefly outline what I've been going thru  
specifically since I've been transferred to TSCI Segregation. all of  
these things have led to the deterioration of my mental health

① I'm being denied ~~no~~ physical therapy which ~~is~~ has caused  
me to be in daily pain for the last 13 months.

② Medical has messed with my meds by delaying my prescriptions  
anywhere from 34 days to 1 wk

③ Staff not replying to letters & grievances & making paperwork  
disappear

④ I was denied seeing the psychiatrist for 10 months  
all of these things have caused me to lose hope & just not  
care what happens. I am discharging from seg (19 months)

⑤ Altho meals are not usually a cause anyone takes seriously as  
everyone complains about the food. At least in seg we are shorted  
our portions, the coffee cold, the tea hot, the bread so dry it crumps  
in your hand. I can put my cold cereal, my hot cereal & the coffee  
cake in my 3" x 3" x 3" cereal bowl at the same time.

I have hepatitis so its important to keep my nutrition up  
so when the meat is served & you receive 1-1½ oz's where  
staff claims 3oz's & the sauces & gravies have so much added  
it's not even my health is suffering. On top

of that they (TSCI) are committing fraud by claiming they feed us more than they actually do thus fooling everyone by claiming high costs to get more funding.

⑥ Sanitation is used as a privilege here in deg. Most seg people are only allowed 1-2 ~~to~~ times per week to clean their cells. As I have Hepatitis as well as a few others & one inmate has HIV this is a serious matter as these diseases are easily caught in prison as 20 people share 2 showers. People wonder why Hep & Aids is so prevalent in prison.

⑦ When we are allowed to exchange our blankets once per week we are given ~~dirty~~ dirty & tattered blankets many not even the length of the bed.

as I said this all breaks you down to where you lose hope & makes you mad, especially when the staff is allowed to mistreat & abuse us with impunity. I'm to the point when I go to bed I pray to not wake up the next morning. It's so bad my next door neighbor a while back cut his own neck/throat in his cell due to not getting proper mental health & he had a history of this type of behavior.

He had related to me just prior to the incident he didn't know how much more he could take as his legal was being messed with like mine.

Since being at TSCI I have witnessed the following:

TSCI deg staff messing with an inmates food to the point he quit eating & staff sat & allowed this for approx 2 months before the inmate was taken out of his cell by wheelchair & over to hospital for surgery.

I watch certain staff ridicule him & abuse him verbally.  
I seen a certain staff member actually mess with his styrafoam tray. I was in D&E with this individual so I knew his physical condition & he was athletic there.  
I watch this man literally lose 70-90 lbs in the 2 months prior to him being taken out. I found out he died within 2 wks of being taken out. It was ruled he died from whatever ailment he had but if you were sick & starved yourself losing near 90 lbs in 2 months this would be the actual cause of death.

I have witnessed a certain staff member sleep on shower days between showers 20-30 min @ 3 days a week. Other staff were well aware this was ~~happ~~ happening & allowing it, although I am sure they will deny it. I saw the staff member almost fall off his chair once.

I have seen staff use meals as punishment on an ~~inmate~~ inmate by not allowing him his meal because he punched the door 30-40 minutes before chow & was told because he acted up that constituted a refusal of his meal & he was denied his shower too.

I've witnessed staff give one inmate information from ~~an~~ another inmates file. ~~you~~

You are forced to do cell door ~~then~~ therapy & staff comes to your cell door & discussed personal & confidential information in the hearing of the whole gallery. One ~~inmate~~ inmate was told by medical

He had A.I.D.'s at his cell door & a good portion of the inmates on the galley verbally abused this person for weeks causing this inmate extreme mental distress.

~~ATB~~ C/O's are coming up to inmates & pumping them up by saying an inmate said this or that about them & then going to the other inmate & saying that the other inmate was saying this or that about them ~~and~~ thus causing problems with 2 inmates & dissention.

All of these things cause: distress, strife, anger, depression & discord leading to mental break downs of various degrees. Its not ~~an~~ unusual for staff at TSCI to bury an inmate in seg for years. I'm here for a fight where I hurt someone but they attacked me ~~unarmed~~ while I was unarmed to start with & they had a club but due to the fact they ~~were~~ <sup>were</sup> a lifer & a snitch they did only 7 days in the hole whereas I will be in seg for 19 months, & lost 6 months goodtime. I had a perfect institutional record & in all of my years in Neb prisons I have never been in a fight except for this one, that's 20 yrs of time.

I would be very interested in talking to someone in person, preferably you on these things & I can provide you with names. I have write the ACLU & the Ombudsmans office on these ~~matter~~ matters. ACLU was very interested and I'm still waiting to hear back from the Ombudsmans office. I offered to take a ~~lie~~ lie detector test to help affirm my accusations & to see if the staff involved would also. I ~~gavente~~ guarantee you the Doc. Staff involved ~~with~~ with Matt who slaved himself, the C/O who slept on duty & the guard/guards.

involved with messing with our food will definately refuse a lie detector test. I plan on going public with the incident involving Matt either <sup>soon</sup> now or in 5 1/2 months when I get out. This is why I am telling you about this because I watched you on T.V. in the last legislative session & was impressed with your humanity & fairness. I am considering writing Senator Chambers but thought since there is a committee to investigate the programs & the mental health issues I would write you personally. Some of these issues I've wrote you about fall inter what the D.O.C Services Special ~~Committee~~ Investigative Committee is inquiring about some not so much, but in short they all impact our physical & mental stability while in segregation & in the extreme resulted in one inmate ~~star~~ starving himself to death & another cutting his own neck/throat

So to me the arbitrary & capricious actions of staff here at TSCI is detrimental in the extreme. In a nutshell the staff here is able to do what they want, when they want & to who they want with impunity & no one can or will stop them. You have staff members who mess with the inmates so bad they have to move the staff member ~~becaus~~ because of death threats on the yard. This is also why staff members are being assaulted in here because they are allow to maliciously committ acts on us & no matter how we complain Administration covers up the problem & this imbues other staff to act

in like matter with near ~~no~~ immunity. Look at the amount of suicides lately. Nevr DOC never had the problems they are experiencing to the degree it is now until the prisons went on lockdown. I have heard & been told to my face by staff that staff likes & wants the Prisons to be on permanent lockdown because it makes their job easier. So I put it to you that could it be possible that DOC might be formenting these problems in a bid to strengthen their claim to need another prison? DOC duped the public & everyone else to get reemsh on the cost & on the need. I was at MSP when the TSCIT issue was going on. DOC kept all of us who had max custody on max custody overriding us to keep us on it for 2-3 yrs & then when DOC finally got their funding almost immediately the bulk of us went to medium & some to minimum custody.

As I said I would be very interested in speaking to you personally on these matters. I understand that you are a very busy man, but I feel some of these issues deserve to be seriously looked into. Earlier in this letter I told you I was going public about Matt starving himself & Martinez cutting his neck & the G's messing & putting stuff in food & I just wanted to afford you the opportunity to investigate this before it goes public.

Additional Comments regarding segregation status: 2)-Lincoln Regional Center because the Dr. testified in court that the man, Eric Lewis, should be mandatorily medicated to treat his schizophrenia. The L.R.C. sent him back to the prison where he stayed in the S.M.U. for years. Now he is in the Protective Custody Unit. I was moved into this cell at 5 p.m. on August 7th. It was obvious to me that Eric Lewis was a seriously mentally disturbed individual by 8 p.m. that evening. The man never actually physically threatened me, but his behavior was violent and aggressive in general. He had conversations with imaginary people in the cell that evening until about 2 a.m.

10) There are currently 2 institutions that provide the OHEL P. They are N.S.P. and O.C.C. I cannot go to N.S.P. because of Central Monitoring issues with multiple individuals and gangs. I need a Discretionary Override to be able to go to the OHEL P at O.C.C. I am eligible to go by the Department of Correctional Services Administrative Regulations as a Medium Custody Inmate. A 90 day Final Hearing date was recommended by the Case Management Team and Administrators at T.S.C.I. I was deferred until my Parole Eligibility Date of January 11th, 2015.

11) I still cannot sleep and suffer anxiety attacks and depression. That was 2 years ago and the symptoms have gotten worse.

Senator Mello,

I just wanted to send you a short letter to thank you for your service to the People in the State of Nebraska. I am obviously writing to you from the Lincoln Correctional Center. I am in the Protective Custody Unit because I have been made a target by gang members at the Nebraska State Penitentiary and was assaulted from behind on 2 different occasions on Oct. 14<sup>th</sup> and Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012.

I was transferred to the Tecumseh State Correctional Institution in May 2013 after serving 7 months on Administrative Confinement at N.S.P. In April 2014 my cell was broken into and my personal property was stolen. I am eligible for parole on January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2015. I cannot allow the actions of gang members effect my chance of getting parole. I had no choice but to seek the voluntary protective custody.

There are so many men and I am sure there ~~are~~ women also in the

prison system that are made targets of by the most violent of the inmates in the system. Older inmates, sex offenders and inmates that have mental health issues are the repeated victims at all of the prisons in this state. I am a victim of 2 assaults and have been seriously affected by the physical trauma of suffering two concussions in two weeks and the psychological and emotional trauma is actually worse than the physical.

Please initiate a discussion to solve these problems that so many incarcerated citizens of this state are suffering. An idea of a nonviolent prison for the most vulnerable inmates in the prison system would be a good start. It would streamline the mandatory programming that I myself need to complete in order to be considered for parole. The cost of health care savings alone would offset the cost of moving inmates within

the system by reducing the fear and stress of these vulnerable inmates.

I believe yours will be the voice of reason on the LR 424 Committee. I have watched your wisdom at work in the Legislature for 2 years now. I honestly believe that there is a much more fiscally responsible solution to the prison overcrowding problem and the lack of programming availability just keeps the log jam in place. My hope is that the Council of State Governments recommends more programming availability, more work release bed space and a different approach to the Parole Board's modus operandi of granting multiple parole opportunities only to the worst behaved inmates. They are obviously not looking at the numbers of recidivism very closely.

I pray that the Legislators of this state take action immediately. I fear that the Federal Government is going to takeover the N.D.C.S. like they did in Iowa 3 decades or so ago.

Many people who choose protective custody is "nature of crime" choice, because really that's the only option for a reason, but also, many of us in that category make the choice simply because we are not "career criminals" nor violent, so it is just easier to avoid trouble, yet in the unit as a whole, we are most definitely not separated from each other, and for the most part, get along just fine. The way people are categorized at D & E, with the points system doesn't work, for instance, I have community custody level points, due to my education and lack of previous trouble, but because I have a 20 year sentence, I am considered "maximum security", even though, after 3 county jail transfers (Lancaster over crowding), my stay at D & E, and now 1 1/2 years here at Tecumseh, I have not 1 single misconduct report, or "write-up", similar to my criminal history other than this one single situation. The way the system is set up currently is similar to going to the Dr. with a broken arm, and instead they put a cast on your leg. Not only do you leave with your actual problem not fixed, now you have to adjust to a cast on your leg, although unnecessary, you now walk through life with a limp. Let's be honest though, if it weren't an election year, nobody would be looking anyhow.
