DATA & SOURCES

The data in the tables, graphs, and maps contained in this report use the most current information available for all 50 states, and in some cases, the District of Columbia. Often, per capita figures are used to account for population differences between states. Source information is located at the bottom of each page, including a link to the raw data. When a ranking was determined using multiple data sets, both sources are listed.

States are ranked from highest to lowest unless otherwise noted. Two states with the same value are generally given the same ranking. However, values are displayed only to a certain decimal place, so states may appear to have the same value, but different rankings because their actual values differ. For each table, the 50-state average was calculated by summing each state's value and dividing the result by the number of states in the table.

Most rankings also include a line graph showing Nebraska over time, a bar graph comparing Nebraska to the national average, and a map illustrating how states rank in comparison to the national average. Bulleted text includes supplemental information about the subject, including definitions, additional rankings, and more detailed data.








POPULATION GROWTH

- The average family size in Nebraska is 3.1, below the national average of 3.23.








Median Age of Population (Years)

 \bullet 13.5% of Nebraska's population is over 65 years old, above the national average of 13%.






GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT



Nebraska Per Capita Gross Domestic Product (Dollars)




Per Capita GDP (Dollars)

 Nebraska is ranked 37th nationally with a real GDP of \$89,785,999,360, comprising 0.6% of total U.S. GDP.








Nebraska Median Annual Household Income (Dollars)








Average Annual Pay in Nebraska (Dollars)





Total Acres Harvested (Millions)



Net Farm Income Per Acre (Dollars)







- From 2000 to 2011, STEM employment in Nebraska increased by 8%. This ranks Nebraska 28th nationally in new STEM jobs, above the national average of 7%.

STEM employment as a percentage of total state employment (2012)





- In Nebraska, 96% of households have access to broadband internet service, and 76% of Nebraska households subscribe to broadband.






Change in Residential Housing Prices (Percent)

Percent Change in Residential Housing Prices (2006-2011)












Nebraska Unemployment Rate (Percent)






Nebraska Poverty Rate (Percent)








Students in Average Daily Attendance per Teacher in Nebraska Elementary and Secondary Schools



Classroom Size






Classroom Size (2011) (Ranked Lowest to Highest)






Average Salary of Nebraska School Teachers (Dollars)



Average Annual Teacher Salary (Dollars)












Nebraska Public High School Dropout Rate (Percent)






Average Composite ACT Score of Nebraska Students








Average Annual Student Costs at Nebraska Public Institutions of Higher Education (Dollars)








Nebraska Population Age 25 or Older with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher (Percent)



Population with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher (Percent)









Education Expenditures as a Percent of All Nebraska Government Expenditures




Education Expenditures as a Percent of All State Expenditures








Nebraskans Not Covered by Health Insurance (Percent)






Nebraska Private-Sector Businesses That Offer Health Insurance Coverage (Percent)






Nebraska Children Covered by Private or Government Health Insurance (Percent)





Percent change in Nebraska Medicare enrollment




Percent change in Medicare enrollment






Medicaid as a Percent of Total Nebraska Spending








Infant Fatalities per 1,000 Live Births in Nebraska








Rate of New Cancer Cases per 100,000 Nebraskans





Life Expectancy at Birth (Years)









Nebraska Per Capita Health Care Expenditures (Dollars)










State and Local Police Officers per 10,000 Nebraskans






Violent Crimes per 100,000 Nebraskans




INCARCERATION RATE








Adults on State Parole per 100,000 Adult Nebraskans








Percent of Parolees Returned to Incarceration in Nebraska








Per Capita Federal Expenditures in Nebraska (Dollars)












Per Capita Nebraska State and Local Debt Outstanding (Dollars)




Nebraska State Employees per 10,000 Population






Active Duty Military Personnel in Nebraska








Eligible Nebraskans Who Voted (Percent)








Per Capita Nebraska Total State Tax Revenue (Dollars)



Per Capita Total State Tax Revenue (Dollars)












Nebraska State Tax Revenue as a Percent of Personal Income








Annual Property Taxes as a Percent of Home Values (Dollars)







Average State Sales and Use Tax Rates






Nebraska Tax Rates on Gasoline (Cents per Gallon)

- From 2006 to 2010, gas prices in Nebraska averaged \$2.254 per gallon, the 13th lowest in the U.S.
- Nebraska is ranked 5th in vehicles per driving age population.
 There are 1.3 vehicles in Nebraska for every driver, compared to the national average of 1.1.
- In Nebraska, drivers spend 5.58 percent of their annual income on gasoline. This ranks Nebraska 32nd nationally, below the U.S. average of 6.11 percent.
- The federal gasoline tax rate is an additional 18.4 cents per gallon. Many states also allow additional local option taxes on gasoline.






