State Boards & Commissions

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### Introduction

Nebraska has some 231 statutorily created boards, commissions, and other similar entities (hereinafter, collectively referred to as boards). Among the many tasks assigned to them, boards provide oversight of governmental programs, regulate licensed professionals, carry out studies, oversee implementation of new programs, advocate for certain constituencies, and advise state agencies.

In 1997, the Executive Board of the Legislative Council requested that the Legislative Research Office compile and annually update a list of statutorily created boards. This publication contains that list. The list does not purposefully include (1) boards created by executive order, by agency rule or regulation, or pursuant to federal mandates, unless enacted via state statute; (2) commissions or councils created pursuant to interstate compacts; or (3) boards created via state statute but which serve local governments.

## Legislative Action Affecting Boards and Commissions

In 2007, the Legislature created six new boards, eliminated three, and renamed six. Five of the renamed boards occurred as part of the massive recodification of state law relating to the credentialing of health professionals.

#### **New Boards**

Hepatitis C Education and Prevention Task Force (LB 144). This task force was created to develop a comprehensive plan to address the increasing epidemic of hepatitis C in Nebraska. The 18-member board includes the chair of the Legislature's Health and Human Services Committee or designee and another member of the Legislature appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council. The remaining members are appointed by the Governor and must include: a disease prevention and health promotion administrator; the state hepatitis coordinator; a state surveillance officer; a behavioral health specialist; a medical provider; a representative of the State Department of Education; a representative of the Department of Veterans' Affairs; a representative of a public health association; a representative of a rural health association; a registered nurse licensed to practice in Nebraska; a primary care physician licensed to practice in Nebraska; a pharmacist licensed to practice in Nebraska; a primary care nurse practitioner licensed to practice in Nebraska; a physician assistant licensed to practice in Nebraska; a laboratory professional; and a Nebraska resident with hepatitis C. The task force receives expenses but no other compensation for its work. A report on its activities and recommendations

is due on or before December 31, 2007 to the Governor and the Health and Human Services Committee.

**Perfusionist Committee (LB 236).** This committee was created to review and make recommendations to the Board of Medicine and Surgery on all matters pertaining to the practice of perfusion that come before the board. A perfusionist is a medical professional trained in the science of diverting patients' blood through a cardiopulmonary bypass machine or similar device that assumes the functions of the patient's organs. LB 236 requires that persons practicing perfusion must be licensed. The committee members are appointed by the State Board of Health and must include two perfusionists and a physician with clinical experience with perfusionists. Members receive expenses and a per diem not to exceed \$50 for each day actually engaged in the discharge of their duties pertaining to the Perfusionist Committee.

Special Education Services Task Force (LB 316). This task force was created to scrutinize special education services. The Legislature's Education Committee chairperson serves as chair of the committee, whose membership also includes two other members of the Legislature, one who is a member of the Education Committee and one who is not. The other members include, a parent of a child receiving special education services in a private setting; two parents of children receiving special education services in a school district; two educational service unit special education teachers; one public school special education teacher; one special education director from a public school or educational service unit; a private school principal or director; one school board member; a special education expert from the State Department of Education; a representative of the State Department of Health and Human Services who has expertise in the placement of state wards; and a representative of a private provider of special education services. The task force is authorized to hold public hearings and to make recommendations for policies and potential legislation by the end 2007.

*Children's Behavioral Health Task Force (LB 542).* This task force was created to prepare a comprehensive children's behavioral health plan for juveniles using public behavioral health services. The plan must be submitted to the Governor and the Legislature's Health and Human Services Committee by December 4, 2007. The task force membership is composed of the chairs of the Legislature's Health and Human Services and Appropriations committees, a member of the Behavioral Health Oversight Commission, two providers of community-based behavioral health services to children, one regional administrator, two representatives of organiza tions advocating on behalf of consumers of children's behavioral health services, a juvenile court judge, two representatives from the Department of Health and Human Services, and the administrator of the Office of Juvenile Services. The task force will also oversee implementation of the plan it recommends until June 30, 2010, when the task force is to submit a recommendation to the Governor and the Legislature as to whether the task force should continue in existence.

*Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council (LB 603).* This council was created to provide statewide coordination for educational service units in order to achieve the most cost-effective services for students, teachers, and school districts. The council's duties include preparing strategic plans to assure cost-efficient and equitable delivery of services across the state; administering statewide initiatives and provision of statewide services; and coordinating distance education. The council also replaces the Distance Education Council, which is disbanded via LB 603. The coordinating council's membership is composed of one administrator from each of the state's educational service units.

Riparian Vegetation Management Task Force (LB 701). This task force was created to assess the growth of unwanted and invasive vegetation clogging the state's rivers and to oversee plans to remove it. The task force's first priority are river basins deemed by the Department of Natural Resources to be fully or overappropriated, specifically the Republican and Platte river basins. The members of the task force include one surface water project representative from each river determined to be fully or overappropriated; one representative each from the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Natural Resources, the office of the Governor, the office of the State Forester, the Game and Parks Commission, and the University of Nebraska; two representatives nominated by the Nebraska Association of Resources Districts; two representatives nominated by the Nebraska Weed Control Association; and one riparian landowner from each of the state's congressional districts. Additionally, any member of the Legislature's Natural Resources Committee can serve at his or her option. The task force is to make preliminary recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by December 15, 2007, and each year thereafter, with a final report due June 30, 2009, when the task force terminates.

#### **Actions Affecting Existing Boards**

This annual publication does not track every change made to existing boards. However, significant changes (for example, changes affecting a board's structure, function, funding, or termination date) are briefly noted below.

*Board of Inquiry and Review (LB 296).* This board is renamed the Veterans' Home Board. It is also given additional duties pertaining to the approval of persons for admission into the state's veterans' homes.

*Economic Development Commission (LB 388).* The Governor is required to appoint members to this commission from private industry sectors. Previously, the Governor was to "consider persons with backgrounds" in certain designated areas for appointment. Additionally, one of the two members appointed from the manufacturing sector must be from a company with no more than 75 employees. Further, "financial services" is added to the description of the representative from the insurance industry and representatives from the fields of biotechnology and information technology and communications are added to the membership.

*Nebraska Brand Committee (LB 422).* The Secretary of State, who was formerly chair of this committee, is instead named a non-voting, ex officio member – along with the Director of Agriculture. The gubernatorially appointed membership is increased from four to five, with at least three members being active cattlepersons and at least one being an active cattle feeder.

*Board of Cosmetologists (LB 463).* This board is renamed the Board of Cosmetology, Electrology, Esthetics, Nail Technology, and Body Art.

*Board of Registration for Environmental Health Specialists* (*LB 463*). This board is renamed the Board of Registered Environmental Health Specialists.

*Board of Examiners in Nursing Home Administration (LB 463).* This board is renamed the Board of Nursing Home Administration.

*Medical Radiographer Advisory Committee (LB 463).* This board is renamed the Board of Medical Radiography.

*Board of Psychologists (LB 463).* This board is renamed the Board of Psychology.

*Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board (LB 661).* The membership of this board is changed by eliminating one representative from the telecommunications industry and adding a representative from the general public.

## Endnotes

<sup>1</sup> A "Y" in this column indicates that a provision authorizing expenses exists in the statute creating the board or commission; an "N" indicates the enacting statute makes no mention of allowing expenses. However, Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 81-1178 provides that "Any member of any state commission, council, committee, or board which has been created by statute shall be entitled to be reimbursed for expenses in the same manner as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177 for state employees whether or not specific reference is made to such sections."

<sup>2</sup> Unless otherwise noted, per diems listed are the maximum allowable in statute for that particular board. Since some statutes indicate that the permissible per diem is "at least" or "up to", the actual per diem paid to a given board member could be less than that listed. As per Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 71-112, the professional boards in the various health-related fields receive expenses as well as a per diem not to exceed \$30. Additionally, the per diem and expenses cannot be greater than "is received in fees from the applicants taking the examination in any particular profession." Each individual board sets its own per diem within those parameters. Additionally, these boards may set per diems and pay the expenses up to this rate for any subcommittees they create.

<sup>3</sup> The State Advisory Council members are paid a fee, set by the Commissioner of Labor, for each day of active service .

<sup>4</sup> The Nebraska State Airline Authority members "shall receive a per diem as the Governor shall determine." However, this authority disbanded after overseeing an intra-state air service study issued in 1990 and has not been re-appointed.

<sup>5</sup> Confirmation is required by a majority of the Legislature's Health and Human Services Committee members.

<sup>6</sup> Compensation for the Task Force for Building Renewal members is "established by the Governor on a per diem basis...."

<sup>7</sup> Legislative confirmation is required for the seven members who are gubernatorial appointees.

<sup>8</sup> The advisory committee is an ad hoc, informal entity comprised of representatives from the University of Nebraska, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Agriculture, and the State Energy Office that provides counsel to the Ethanol Board on an as needed basis, according to Todd Sneller, executive director of the Ethanol Board.

<sup>9</sup> LB 1161 states, "Each member of the board shall receive as compensation the same per diem and travel expenses as other state employees for each day actually spent in traveling to and from and while attending sessions of the board and its committees or authorized meetings of the National Association of State Boards of Geology, or their subdivisions or committees, and all necessary expenses incident to the performance of his or her duties under the Geologists Regulation Act as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177."

<sup>10</sup> "The board, when appointed and convened, shall continue in existence only until it has resolved a dispute referred to it pursuant [to statute]." Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 46-719(1a).

<sup>11</sup> There are actually 33 commissions of nine members each representing the various judicial districts and courts within the state.

<sup>12</sup> The Livestock Auction Market Board is a three-person board with one appointed member, who receives expenses.

<sup>13</sup> The Legislature confirms the three gubernatorial appointees to the 16-member commission.

<sup>14</sup> The three lay members of the board are the only members to receive a per diem, which is set at the same rate as that paid to the members of the State Highway Commission.

<sup>15</sup> The chairman of the Real Estate Commission is the Secretary of State, who does not receive a per diem.

<sup>16</sup> Four of the 11 members are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature.

<sup>17</sup> The committee is no longer awarding grants and exists only statutorily while the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education Commission continues to administer the remaining multiple-year grants. See, Laws 2003, LB 574.

<sup>18</sup> Membership is comprised of the State Board of Education.
